Welcome! Magness Memorial Tree Farm is private property owned and operated by the World Forestry Center in Portland, Oregon. The World Forestry Center is a non-profit organization supported by membership contributions, grants, donations and admission fees. We are very pleased to have you and your students as our guests for this special, educational program.

The program you have chosen is detailed below. Please be sure to read all enclosed information to ensure that your visit will be both enjoyable and safe.

Designed specifically for boys' and girls' youth groups ages 8-10. Completion of this very popular "mini-course" will satisfy many of the requirements for beginning level forestry, conservation or natural resource badges. Approximately two hours of the course is indoor, hands-on activities and one hour is outdoors. Topics covered may include, but are not limited to: tree identification, tree growth, wildfires and how to plant a tree (seeds are given to participants to take home and plant.)

We go rain or shine! All students and chaperones should be dressed for the weather and be in good health and able to walk uphill and downhill on trails. Reservations are necessary and accepted on a strict first-come, first-served basis. \$5.00 per student, adult chaperones are free.

## Some Helpful Tips:

- Getting Here: Arrive at the Tree Farm at least 10-15 minutes prior to the start of your program. The parking lot is rather small and other groups may be visiting. Carpooling is recommended.
- Restrooms: Toilets and drinking fountains are located at the education center. Plan ahead-there are no restrooms on the trails!
- Check-in: Bring your confirmation letter and additional payment if necessary. Check in with the World Forestry Center staff member when your group is all assembled and ready.
- Clothing: All participants should be dressed for outdoor activities-rain or shine! This includes sturdy walking shoes or hiking boots and appropriate clothing, including rain gear if necessary. We suggest dressing in easy-to-add or shed layers to account for changes in temperature or exertion levels. Trails can be muddy and extra shoes or clothes in the car may be useful for the ride home.
- Safety: All children must be accompanied by an adult at all times. Please leave all hunting or wood carving knives in the car. No rock throwing, horseplay, running or pushing in any of the buildings or along the trails. Students with behavior problems will be asked to leave the group.
- Odds and Ends: This is a program for children. Adult participation is welcome, but please remember who the intended audience really is. Younger siblings are welcome to visit the Tree Farm, but this program may be too long or rigorous for their enjoyment. Please no pets.
